AGENDA ITEM #1 - CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m.

AGENDA ITEM #2 - APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of May 3, 2021 were approved as submitted.

AGENDA ITEM #3 - OLD BUSINESS

AGENDA ITEM #4 – COURTESY OF THE FLOOR

A. Trexler Boulevard Safety Concerns

Mr. David Stever presented a concern related to safety issues on Trexler Boulevard. He indicated that the road is narrow to the point where pedestrian safety becomes a concern, especially where two vehicles need to pass each other in opposite directions. Vehicles seem to exceed the posted speed limit on the road. He also questioned as to if a stop sign or speed bump could be installed on Trexler Boulevard to slow traffic.

Chief Dorney indicated that the police department has performed speed timing on Trexler Boulevard. It is difficult for them to do this due to the constraints of the speed tracking system used by the Department. Installation of a stop sign could only be performed after completion of a traffic study. The Township does not install speed bumps on Township roads as it presents problems related to the public works department maintenance of the roads.

Chief Dorney will check to see if a traffic study has been performed previously on Trexler Boulevard.

B. Traffic Concern – Chapmans Road at Grammes Road

Mrs. Monica Hodges inquired about safety concerns regarding the curve on Chapmans Road near the intersection of Grammes Road. With the increase in truck traffic expected to occur with the opening of new warehouses in the area, this curve presents on that is difficult for trucks to navigate while staying in their lane of travel.

Mr. Frantz indicated that this curve is to be rebuilt as part of an upcoming warehouse project. This will help to improve the conditions for truck traffic.

AGENDA ITEM #5 - NEW BUSINESS

A. Commissioner's Report

B. Fire Companies Report

Chief Heicklen submitted the response report for Cetronia for the month of May 2021. It is included as an attachment to these minutes. Cetronia responded to sixty-six calls for the month of May 2021.

The fire departments responded to several motor vehicle accidents with rescue in May. The south side of the Township was also hit hard by a thunder storm on May 26, 2021. This resulted in damage to trees, power lines, and houses.

The fire departments noticed that residents came out of their homes after the storm and were walking around area where there were downed power lines.

Officer Grozier indicated that he can write up a new release related to the dangers experienced after storms and can disseminate it to the community.

Coordinator Kelly sent photos of the damage to the National Weather Service. They indicated that the damage was caused by straight-line winds around seventy miles per hour.

Chief Garger submitted the response report via email for Greenawalds for the month of May 2021. It is included as an attachment to these minutes. Greenawalds responded to sixty calls for the month of May 2021.

Assistant Chief McCauley submitted the response reports via email for Tri-Clover for the month of May 2021 and year-to-date 2021. They are included as attachments to these minutes. Tri-Clover responded to twenty-two calls for the month of May 2021 and one hundred and twenty-three calls year-to-date 2021.

Chief Search reported that Woodlawn responded to fifty-eight calls for the month of May 2021.

C. Fire Commissioner Report

D. Emergency Management Team Report

Coordinator Kelly indicated that the phone notification system for the Arch Street Dam is being established.

E. Police Report

Officer Grozier reported that the Police responded to one thousand and fifty-three calls for the month of May 2021 and five-thousand, seven-hundred and thirty-six calls year-to-date 2021.

The police are taking application for the advanced youth police academy and the citizen's police academy.

F. Emergency Medical Services Report

Chief Executive Officer Mateff reported that Cetronia responded to twohundred and seventy calls for the month of May 2021. One of those calls was handled a mutual aid provider.

Call volume has been increasing, partly due to the opening of Dorney Park.

Cetronia is not having issues obtaining EMS supplies, however, the price of the supplies has risen approximately forty percent.

G. Subdivision Review

A. Ridge Farm – Major Plan 2017-101

Mr. Frantz indicated that the only change from the previously reviewed plan was a plan detailing the specific traffic calming measures to be provided on Chalmette Road. The details of additional signage, crosswalks, and curb cuts are consistent with that presented previously in concept only.

The Commission made no new recommendations to the plan.




