AGENDA ITEM #1 - CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m.

Chairman Yezerski led a moment of silence for those who perished in attacks of September 11, 2001.

AGENDA ITEM #2 - APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of August 7, 2023 were approved as submitted.

AGENDA ITEM #3 - OLD BUSINESS

None.

AGENDA ITEM #4 - COURTESY OF THE FLOOR

A. Comfort Dog Toys

Coordinator Kelly presented the idea of the emergency services distributing toy fire and police dogs to children at critical incidents. The toys are available on Amazon, and a Township employee has indicated a donation of \$200 to start funding for the project.

The members of the Commission were in agreement with distributing these toys to children at emergency scenes. They agreed to request the Board of Commissioners to explore they idea of purchasing these toys for future distribution.

B. Emergency Services Reports

Members of the Commission indicated that they desired to hear more data presented as part of the reports including response times, mutual aid calls responded to outside of the township and mutual aid necessitated by outside agencies covering for township agencies, and the emergency alarm ordinance program status and data. There is a concern that our emergency services agency's ability to handle calls within the township may be hindered by them running mutual aid outside of the township.

AGENDA ITEM #5 - NEW BUSINESS

A. Commissioner's Report

Commissioner Kelly commended the emergency services and the township public works and administrative departments for their actions during the significant storm event on the evening of August 7, 2023.

B. Fire Companies Report

Chief Diaz reported that Cetronia responded to eighty-seven calls for the month of August 2023. Fifteen of those responses were related to the August 7, 2023 storm.

Chief Garger reported that Greenawalds responded to one hundred and twenty-three calls for the month of August 2023. Forty-two of those responses were related to the August 7, 2023 storm.

Chief Neas submitted the response reports via email for Tri-Clover for the month of August 2023 and year-to-date 2023. They are included as attachments to these minutes. Tri-Clover responded to forty-two calls for the month of August 2023 and two-hundred and twenty-eight calls year-to-date 2023.

Chief Search submitted the response report for Woodlawn for the month of August 2023. It is included as an attachment to these minutes. Woodlawn responded to one hundred and thirty-five calls for the month of August 2023.

C. Fire Commissioner Report

None.

D. Emergency Management Team Report

Coordinator Kelly indicated that the Township Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was staffed following a severe storm on the evening of August 7, 2023. Most calls for service were routed through the EOC instead of through Lehigh County Communications Center. This aided in both the Communications Center and our township and emergency services in operating more efficiently. A Google mapping program will be looked at for future use during these types of events.

The active aggressor drill was held on August 9, 2023 at the Orefield Middle School. The after-action report is expected to be completed this month and will be disseminated once it is completed.

The Township Family Safety Day event scheduled for September 9, 2023 was cancelled due to a forecast of inclement weather.

The next Township emergency Management meeting will be held on September 14, 2023.

The Limerick Generating Station Drill will be held on September 26, 2023.

Sunoco will be testing their pipeline that crosses the Township this month. This is the pipeline that is located along the property of the Joint Operations Center.

The Lehigh County Hazard Mitigation Plan is in the process of being updated. The public can make comments on the plan through a website link posted on the Township website.

E. Police Report

Chief Dorney submitted the police report via email for August 2023. It is included as an attachment to these minutes.

F. Emergency Medical Services Report

Chief Executive Officer Mateff reported that Cetronia responded to threehundred and seventy-six calls for the month of August 2023. Nine of those calls were handled my mutual aid providers. The average response time was ten minutes, and an average of fifty-three minutes were spent on each call.

G. Parkland School District Report

Dr. Naradko indicated that Parkland will be closed 9/25/23, homecoming is 10/13/23, the fall play is 10/7/23-10/8/23, and the family show is 11/18/23-11/19/23. The next Parkland Emergency Management meeting is scheduled for 10/5/23.

H. Subdivision Review

1. Proposed St. Paul Antiochian Orthodox Church, Major Plan 2023-104

Mr. Frantz indicated that this is a sketch plan, not a full plan submission. The Commission made the following recommendations to the plan.

a. A complete set of plans for the subdivision should be submitted for review by the Commission.

- b. A second fire hydrant complying with the SALDO distance requirement to buildings should be provided.
- c. The traffic circulation lanes around the building should be a minimum width of twenty feet.
- d. Fire lanes should be proposed for the paved areas near the building.





Woodlawn Fire Department


