#### **AGENDA ITEM #1 - CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### A. Commissioner's Report

None.

#### **B. Fire Companies Report**

Mr. Frantz conveyed Chief Diaz' report that Cetronia responded to fiftyone calls for the month of February 2024.

Chief Garger submitted the response report via email for Greenawalds for the month of February 2024. It is included as an attachment to these minutes. Greenawalds responded to fifty-five calls for the month of February 2024.

Commissioner Peischl commented that the structure of the reports submitted by Greenawalds provide useful information presented in an easy-to-understand format.

Chief Garger indicated that the report structure is present in the Emergency Reporting software that all four departments use to prepare their reports.

Chief Neas submitted the response reports via email for Tri-Clover for the month of February 2024 and year-to-date 2024. They are included as attachment to these minutes. Tri-Clover responded to thirty-two calls for the month of February 2024 and seventy-one calls year-to-date 2024. Mr. Frantz indicated that Chief Neas was absent at the meeting due to attendance at a training class.

Chief Search submitted the response reports for Woodlawn for the months of January and February 2024. They are included as attachments to these minutes. Woodlawn responded to fifty-four calls for the month of January 2024 and sixty-nine calls for the month of February 2024.

#### C. Emergency Management Team Report

Coordinator Kelly submitted the Emergency Management report for the month of February 2024. It is included as an attachment to these minutes.

The next township Emergency Management meeting will be held on March 14, 2024.

EMA Coordinators throughout Lehigh County have been trained on the use of Skywarn.

Tab 3 of the Township EOP has been updated and is being distributed.

Nativity Lutheran Church has submitted their updated emergency plan.

The Lehigh Emergency Service Training Academy (LESTA) is once again functioning. Coordinator Kelly is serving on the LESTA Board.

The PA Route 309 & Tilghman Street interchange reconstruction project will be commencing in 2025. They have agreed to provide third-party traffic control during the project.

Commissioner Peischl expressed his concern about Tilghman Street being reduced from four lanes to two lanes during the construction.

Chief Garger indicated that he has received the Tier 2 report from Geo Specialty Chemical.

#### D. Police Report

Sergeant Grozier reported that the Police responded to one thousand and seventy-two calls, had seventy-six reported crimes, made thirty-seven arrests, and issued eighty-two citations and one hundred and forty-five warnings for the month of February 2024.

#### E. Emergency Medical Services Report

Chief Executive Officer Mateff reported that Cetronia responded to twohundred and seventy-four calls for the month of February 2024. Seven of those calls were handled my mutual aid providers. The busiest time for responses is mid-week between the hours of 4PM to 5PM. The average duration of the calls is fifty minutes and thirty-two seconds.

#### F. Parkland School District Report

Dr. Naradko reported that the Spring Musical will be held April 1-14, 2024. Kindergarten registration is now open for the 2024/2025 school year. Both the boys and girls basketball teams have won their divisions and are advancing to the District playoffs. The Community Resource Day event will be held on April 16, 2024.

#### G. Subdivision Review

#### 1. Nestle Purina Wastewater Treatment Upgrades – Major Plan 2021-102

The Commission recommended that the following comments of the Fire Marshal be addressed on the plans.

- The fire apparatus turning radius drawing should be changed to provide the vehicle approach from the main gate side of the access road to the new wastewater building.
- b. Soil bearing details for the entirety of the gravel fire department access road should be indicated in order to determine if it will support heavy fire apparatus.
- c. The proposed fire water line size should be indicated on the plan.
- d. The proposed fire water line should be indicated up to the connection point to the existing water system.
- e. A SALDO compliant fire hydrant should be indicated for the proposed building on the north side of the complex.
- f. The SWT specification detail for fire hydrants should be included on the plans.

#### 2. Dorney Park Project 2024 - Major Plan 2023-101

The Commission made no recommendations to the plan.










